



Phi Theta Kappa

Phi Theta Kappa is the international honor society for twoyear colleges, symbolizing excellence in higher education and a commitment to students. Phi Theta Kappa has recognized and encouraged scholarships among two-year college students for 87 years by providing stimulation and enrichment while promoting the academic integrity of the associate degree program. For these reasons, the American Association of Community Colleges has designated Phi Theta Kappa the official honor society for two-year colleges.

The All-Virginia Academic Team

Virginia is one of 39 states participating in the All-State Academic Teams program introduced in 1994 as a way to provide scholastic recognition to Phi Theta Kappa members while promoting excellence at two-year colleges. Students nominated to the national All-USA Academic Team are automatically named to the All-State Academic Teams and are eligible for scholarships provided by Coca-Cola. Ranking on the All-State teams is generally determined by the student's score in the national competition. The All-Virginia Academic Team is designed to recognize high achieving college students who demonstrate academic excellence and intellectual rigor combined with leadership and service that extends their education beyond the classroom to benefit society.

2024 Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team

The Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation sponsors the Coca-Cola Community College Academic Team. Fifty students will be named Gold Scholars, each receiving a \$1,500 scholarship; fifty students will be named Silver Scholars, each receiving a \$1,250 scholarship; and fifty students will be named Bronze Scholars, each receiving a \$1,000 scholarship. A state may have multiple Gold, Silver, or Bronze Scholars. All scholars will also receive special medallions. In addition, the Coca-Cola Foundation, along with the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation and Phi Theta Kappa will recognize a top scoring transfer student, New Century Transfer Scholar, and the top scoring workforce student, New Century Workforce Scholar, from each state. The New Century Transfer Scholar will receive a \$2,250 award and the New Century Workforce Scholar will receive a \$1,250 award.
